

Make a 3D vessel using wet-felting techniques

Wet-felting with wool is an easy and inexpensive way to discover three-dimensional art. You will learn how to lay out wool and other fibres around a flat resist (template), to create a cover for holding a glass vase. Applying water, soap, your hands and other tools, you will transform loose fibres into a fabric that can be shrunk and shaped into a 3-D form. These techniques are the foundation for making other hollow forms, such as bowls, bags, purses, hats, pillows, and more.

Fee: \$65, includes small glass vase; wool and decorative fibres; a basic wet-felting kit; the use of felting tools, unscented dish soap, resist material.

Optional to bring: old, small bath towel/hand towel, ~600 ml margarine or yogurt container to hold water; notepad and pencil, apron
