BYLAW NO. 2/62.

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR ENFORCEMENT OF THE BYLAWS OF  
THE VILLAGE.

The Council of the Village of Elbow, of the Province of Saskatchewan,  
enacts as follows:

1. This bylaw shall be known and referred to as "The General Penalty Bylaw" of the Village.
2. Section 3 shall apply only to an infraction of a bylaw of the Village for which no other penalty is provided and which such bylaw states shall incur the penalties herein provided.
3. Subject to the provisions of Section 2, any person found guilty of an infraction of any bylaw of the Village passed by authority of the Village Act shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred Dollars and costs for every offence, and in default of payment, to imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty days unless the said penalty and costs including costs of committal, are sooner paid.
4. All penalties and fines imposed for infraction of a bylaw shall, unless otherwise provided for, be paid to the Treasurer for the public use of the Village.

A BYLAW TO ALLOW A DISCOUNT FOR THE  
PROMPT PAYMENT OF CURRENT TAXES.


The Council of The Village of Elbow in the Province of Saskatchewan,

- (c) A discount of Two percent shall be allowed on all current taxes paid before the First day of December.

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE LICENSING OF OCCUPANTS OF TRAILERS  
AND PORTABLE SHACKS.

The Council of the Village of Elbow in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. Every occupant of a trailer or portable shack used for residential purposes within the confines of this Village shall within a period of thirty days register his vehicle and date of entry with the secretary of the Village. Immediately after a period of thirty days the occupant shall obtain a license from the secretary of the Village.
2. The schedule of fees for a license shall be based on length, manufacturer's specifications, will apply and shall be as follows:
  - A. For trailers and portable shacks not in an approved trailer camp;

20 feet and under	\$3.00 per month.
21 to 35 feet	\$4.50 per month.
Over 35 feet	\$6.00 per month.
  - B. For trailers and portable shacks located in an approved trailer camp the license fee shall be one-half of the amount set out in the foregoing Schedule.
3. Where it is determined that any such trailer or portable shack is located for some time within and for some time not within an approved trailer camp but located within the Village for a total period of thirty days or more, the license fee payable shall be in accordance with schedule "A" of this bylaw.
4. This bylaw shall be subject to the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs of Saskatchewan.
5. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any provision of this bylaw shall be subject to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Village.

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE LICENSING OF OPERATORS OF  
TRAILER PARKS OR CAMPS.

The Council of the Village of Elbow of the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. No person shall operate a trailer park or court within the boundaries of the Village without first obtaining a licence from the secretary-treasurer.
2. The licence fee shall be payable in advance and shall expire on December 31st next following the date of issue.
3. The licence fee shall be Five Dollars.
4. The operator of a trailer park or camp licensed under this bylaw is hereby authorized and required to collect from the occupant of any trailer or portable shack situated within the confines of the park or camp such licence fee as is required to be paid by such occupant under bylaw No. 4/62 of the Village unless the said occupant produces a valid licence for inspection.
5. All fees collected under section 4 of this bylaw shall forthwith after collection be turned over to the secretary-treasurer of the Village.
6. It shall be the responsibility of the operator of a trailer park or camp licensed under this bylaw to register each trailer or portable shack located therein in a proper record maintained for that purpose showing the name of the occupant, date of arrival, date of departure, and the number of any valid licence held by the occupant issued under bylaw 4/62 of the Village. Any fees collected under section 4 of this bylaw shall be reported also opposite the name of the registered occupant, together with the date of collection.
7. The record mentioned in section 6 shall be open to inspection at all times to the licence inspector of the Village.
8. Sections 4 to 7 and section 9 shall apply mutatis mutandis to every owner or occupant of property who permits two or more trailers or portable shacks to be located thereon.
9. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any provision of this bylaw shall be subject to the penalties provided in the general penalty bylaw of the Village.

## A BYLAW TO CLASSIFY, LICENSE, REGULATE AND GOVERN TRANSIENT TRADERS.

The Council of the Village of Elbow of the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. In this bylaw the expression "transient trader" shall have the meaning ascribed to it by section 2, paragraph 23 of the Village Act, as the same may be from time to time amended and substituted.
2. No person shall carry on the business of a transient trader within the Village unless he possesses a valid and subsisting license for that purpose issued in accordance with the provisions of this bylaw.
3. The Secretary-Treasurer of the Village is hereby authorized to issue a transient trader's licence to any person:
  - (a) who intends to offer goods or merchandise for sale within the village, by retail or public auction, or solicits any person who is not a wholesaler or retail dealer for orders for future delivery of goods and merchandise; and
  - (b) who is not a commercial agent as defined by the Commercial Agents Act, 1958; and
  - (c) who is not assessable by the Village assessor for the purposes of business taxation for the then current year in respect of such proposed business; and
  - (d) who makes written application for such license, stating specifically the nature of the business he proposes to conduct within the Village; and
  - (e) who has complied with The Auctioneers Act if the same applies or may apply in respect of the license for which he has made application under this bylaw, and
  - (f) who tenders with his application the proper license fee as herein provided for.

4. Subject to the right of the Council to suspend or revoke the same as provided by the Village Act, every license issued hereunder shall remain in force and effect until and including the thirty-first day of December of the year of issue.

5. (1) Subject to Subsection (2) the fee payable for a license under this bylaw shall be as follows:

Where goods or merchandise are to be offered for sale:

(a) by retail only	\$5.00
(b) By public auction only	\$5.00
(c) by either or both methods, at the option of the licensee	\$7.50.

5. (2) Where a license is issued hereunder after July 1st of any year for the sale of goods or merchandise by retail only, the fee payable under clause (a) of subsection (1) shall be reduced by forty (40%) percent.
6. Every license issued hereunder shall state specifically the kind or kinds of goods or merchandise which the licensee is authorized to offer for sale within the Village, and whether he may offer the same for sale by retail or by public auction or at his option by either method. Such license shall also state the restrictions as set forth in Section 7 hereof.
7. No person to whom a license is issued under this bylaw shall offer for sale or solicit orders for the future delivery of goods or merchandise thereunder within the Village:
- (a) other than of a kind described therein; or
  - (b) by any method except as authorized therein; or
  - (c) by retail at any time or during any period when shops within the Village exposing or offering similar goods or merchandise for sale by retail are required by Village bylaw to be and remain closed; or
  - (d) by public auction, if the Auctioneers Act applies, unless he himself is licensed under that Act or has engaged some one so licensed to conduct such sale.
8. Every person licensed under this bylaw shall, at all reasonable times, upon request of the Secretary-Treasurer, the Village Constable or License Inspector, or any Peace Officer, produce such license for inspection purposes.
9. Any person who violates any provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to the penalties as provided in the general penalty bylaw of the village.

A BYLAW TO LICENSE CONTRACTORS.

The Council of the Village of Elbow, of the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. Every person who enters into a contract for the erection, alteration, painting, insulating, or repair of buildings or structures; the installation of heating plants, electrical, gas, plumbing, television antenna, or other fixtures; or the performance of other similar work in the village shall first obtain a license from the secretary-treasurer, and shall pay in advance the following licence fee:
  - (a) For a contractor who undertakes to erect, alter, paint, insulate or repair buildings or structures-----\$25.00
  - (b) For a contractor who undertakes to instal heating plants, electrical, gas, or plumbing fixtures, or other similar work-----\$50.00
2. All licenses issued under this bylaw shall expire on the thirty-first day of December next following the date of issue, and the license fees mentioned herein shall apply regardless of the date of issue.
3. For the purpose of this bylaw, the word "contractor" shall be held to include any person, firm, or corporation.
4. Any contractor licensed under this bylaw shall produce and exhibit his license when required to do so by the license inspector, village constable, or other authorized person.
5. Any contractor found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the general penalty bylaw of the village.

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE USE OF DRAYS.


The Council of the Village of Elbow, of the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:


1. Every person performing work with horses, motor truck or tractors for hire in the Village shall obtain a license from the secretary-treasurer of the village and shall pay in advance a license fee of \$25.00.
2. All licenses granted under this bylaw, unless expressly granted for a shorter period, shall expire on the thirty-first day of December next following the date of issue. The sum payable for a license required after the first day of July shall be three-fifths of the charge for a full year.
3. No person shall follow or carry on the business, trade or calling of draying for hire, without first having obtained such license and paid the license fee.
4. No person ~~XXXX~~ to whom a license is granted under this bylaw shall charge a greater amount than the following:

For unloading and delivering per carload, at the rate of \$25.00 per car of 40,000 lbs. capacity; for one horse by the day \$12.00; for two horses by day \$15.00; For a truck by the day \$25.00; For a horse dray by the load or less \$2.00; for a 2horse dray by the load \$3.00; for a truck not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$4.00 per load.

5. Every person to whom a license is granted under this bylaw shall have his equipment at the call of the public at least eight hours in each working day and shall, when hired to unload, unload such car within twenty-four hours after such hiring if requested to do so by the hirer, and, if such licensee neglects or refuses to do so, the hirer may, if no other licensee is available, employ any person not having a license to unload such car, in which case such person shall not be guilty of an infraction of this bylaw.
6. The person in whose name a license is taken out shall be deemed the owner of the horse, dray or truck licensed, and shall be liable to the penalties imposed for an infraction of this bylaw whether committed by him or by an employee.
7. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Village.

A BYLAW TO LICENSE PERSONS HAVING BILLIARD OR POOL TABLES OR BOWLING ALLEYS

The council of the Village of Elbow, of the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. No person shall keep or have in his possession for hire or gain any billiard or pool table or bowing alley without having first obtained a license to do so.
2. Any person requiring a license for a billiard or pool table or bowling alley shall make written application therefor to the secretary-treasurer stating the name and address of the applicant, the location of the premises to be used and the number of tables or alleys for which the license is required, and shall pay in advance a fee of Ten (10) Dollars for the first table and Five Dollars for each additional table; Ten Dollars for the first alley and Five Dollars for each additional alley.
3. All licenses shall expire on December 31st next following the date of issue and shall be subject to the provisions of section 4 to 7 hereof, which shall be embodied in the license.
4. No person under the age of sixteen years shall be permitted to enter, play games in, be employed in, remain on or loiter about the pool hall portion of the premises, and the proprietor or his employee shall be responsible for the enforcement of this provision.
5. The premises shall be open to view during business hours, but shall be closed at and no playing shall be allowed after twelve o'clock p.m.
6. The premises shall remain closed and no playing shall be allowed at any time on Sunday and Good Friday.
7. No betting or gambling or foul language of any kind shall be permitted on the premises.
- d. n These premises to be licensed shall be partitioned off from any other business premises.
9. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Village.

A BYLAW of The VILLAGE of Elbow to FIX THE RATES TO BE CHARGED by way of rent or service charge for the use of the sewer against persons who own or occupy premises drained or which by Bylaw are required to be drained into a sewer:

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary that the properties or premises drained or required by bylaw to be drained into a sewer of the Village shall be charged a reasonable rent or service charge for the use of the said sewer: AND WHEREAS the Council may by bylaw regulate the times when and the manner in which the rent is to be paid, may classify the premises drained according to the size and character of the buildings comprised therein, and uses to which they are put or the nature of the business conducted upon the premises and may fix different rates for different classes;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the Village of Elbow enacts as follows:

1. Persons who own or occupy premises drained, or require to be drained into the sewer by bylaw, shall pay such service a monthly rent or service charge in accordance with the following:

Domestics--\$2.25

Business--\$4.50

School---\$12.00

Hotel---\$25.00

Motel---\$16.50

Trailer Court--

\$4.50 plus 50 cents per occupied trailer space per month.

2. The above rates shall remain in force for one year from the date of their approval by the Local Government Board and until the scale is revised or new are prescribed by the Board:

3. The rent or service charge hereby imposed shall be payable quarterly in advance and shall be paid at the office of the Secretary-Treasurer:


4. Rents charged under this bylaw may be levied and collected in the same manner as taxes, which are not a lien upon the land;

5. This bylaw shall come into effect on, from and after the day and date upon which the approval of the Local Government Board is obtained hereto.

BYLAW NO. 11/62.

A BYLAW TO LICENSE, REGULATE AND GOVERN PLACES OF AMUSEMENT.

THE Council of the Village of Elbow of the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. Every person conducting a place of amusement within the Village shall first obtain a licence from the secretary-treasurer, and shall pay therefor in advance:-
  - (a) for each motion picture theatre---\$35.00
  - (b) for each dance hall or pavilion---\$35.00.
  - (c) for each other place of amusement--\$30.00.
2. No person shall conduct any place of amusement within the Village without having first obtained a licence and paid the prescribed fee.
3. Every place of amusement shall at all times be properly conducted; kept in a clean and sanitary condition, and shall be subject to inspection at any time by the licence inspector or health officer.
4. All licences granted under this bylaw shall expire on the thirty-first day of December next following the date of issue.
5. The person in whose name the licence is issued shall be liable to the penalties imposed for an infraction of this bylaw, whether committed by himself or by an employee.
6. All places of public amusement shall be closed by 12 o'clock midnight Saturday and remain closed until Eight A.M. on the Monday following.
7. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Village.


A BYLAW TO PREVENT THE IMPROPER USE OF SIDEWALKS.

The Council of the Village of Elboe, of the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:--

1. No person shall park, lead, ride or drive any vehicle or any animal on or across any sidewalk, boulevard or grass plot within the village before obtaining from the village secretary a permit to do so, in which case the person so doing shall put down planking or other material sufficient to prevent damage to the property, such planking or material to be removed immediately thereafter;  
provided that this shall not apply to a sidewalk crossing at any street or lane intersection, or to any other sidewalk crossing constructed by the council.
2. No person shall ride a bicycle on any sidewalk.
3. No person shall permit any part of any vehicle or other obstruction to project onto any sidewalk or otherwise restrict the free use of any sidewalk by pedestrians.
4. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Village.

A BYLAW TO LICENSE AND REGULATE THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF DOGS.

The Council of the Village of Elbow, of the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. Every person who owns, possesses or harbors a dog (which term shall, for the purposes of this bylaw, be deemed to mean either a male or female over six months old) within the village shall obtain a license from the secretary-treasurer, and shall pay in advance the sum of \$4.00 for each female, \$2.00 for each male, and \$2.00 for each spayed female. The sum payable for a license required after July 1st shall be three-fifths of the charge for a full year.
2. All licenses issued under the provisions of this bylaw shall expire on December 31st next following the date of issue.
3. Any person residing in the Village who owns, possesses or harbors a dog, and neglects or refuses to take out a license therefore shall be deemed guilty of an infraction of this bylaw,
4. Every person to whom a license has been issued under this bylaw shall cause his dog to wear a collar to which shall be attached the license tag issued by the village,
5. No dog shall be allowed to run at large in the village, and for the purpose of this bylaw, a dog shall be deemed to be running at large when it is beyond the boundaries of the land occupied by the owner, possessor or harbours of the said dog, or beyond the boundaries of any lands where it may be with the permission of the owner or occupant of the said land and when it is not under control by being;
  - (a) in direct and continuous charge of a person competent to control it; or
  - (b) securely confined within an enclosure; or
  - (c) securely fastened so that it cannot roam at will.
6. No vicious dog shall be allowed to run at large at any time.
7. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any provision of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in The General Penalty bylaw of the village.

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

The Council of the Village of Elbow, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. For the purpose of this bylaw the expression:
  - (a) "public highway" means any street, lane or public highway within the Village, but does not include a provincial highway therein as designated pursuant to the provisions of The Highways and Transportation Act,
  - (b) "motor vehicle" shall have the meaning ascribed to it by The Vehicles Act, 1957;
  - (c) "speed zone" means any portion of a public highway within the Village of Elbow which has been established as a speed zone by resolution of the council, and identified by a sign erected and maintained at each end thereof, indicating the maximum speed applicable thereto.
2. (1) Subject to the provisions of The Vehicles Act, 1957, the Council may by resolution establish speed zones on the public highways within the Village of Elbow or any one of them or on any parts or portions of any such highways.  
(2) Any resolutions passed under the provisions of subsection(1) shall designate the maximum speed applicable to each speed zone so established.  
(3) The maximum speed designated in respect to any speed zone established under subsection(1) shall not exceed thirty-five(35) miles an hour.  
(4) The council shall cause to be erected and maintained at each end of a speed zone established under this bylaw a suitable sign indicating the maximum speed applicable thereto.
3. Subject to The Vehicles Act, 1957, and to section 5 hereof, no person shall drive a motor vehicle on any public highway in any speed zone established pursuant to the provisions of this bylaw at a speed greater than the maximum speed as fixed therefor by resolution of the council.
4. Subject to The Vehicles Act, 1957, and to section 5 hereof, no person shall drive a motor vehicle upon any portion of any public highway within the Village of Elbow to which sections 2 and 3 hereof are not applicable at a speed in excess of twenty-five (25) miles an hour.
5. Nothing in sections 3 or 4 hereof shall be deemed to apply to fire engines, fire department apparatus, or police cars when on emergency duty.
6. Any person who violates any provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to the penalties as prescribed in the general penalty bylaw of the Village, being number 2/62 passed on the 21st day of March, 1962.

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE ERECTION AND OBSERVANCE OF TRAFFIC SIGNS.

The Council of the Village of Elbow, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:


1. In this bylaw the expression:

- (a) "highway" or "street" means any highway or street within the village;
- (b) "servient street" means any street which intersects a stop street;
- (c) "stop street" means any street or portion thereof so designated by resolution of the council.

2. (1) The council may by resolution from time to time designate any street or portion thereof, as a "stop street".
- (2) The council shall cause to be erected and maintained at the right hand side of every servient street, at a distance of approximately ten (10) feet from the point of its intersection with a "stop" street, an appropriate sign containing the word "stop". Such sign shall be so placed that it will face traffic on such servient street which is approaching the "stop" street.
- (3) The provisions of subsection (1) of section 140 of The Vehicles Act, 1957, shall apply to all traffic approaching and facing a stop sign erected and maintained in accordance with the provisions of subsection (2).
3. (1) The council may by resolution from time to time provide for the erection and maintenance at any intersection of streets, to the right or more to the right of way" signs.
- (2) The council shall in every such resolution designate the direction in which each such sign shall face.
- (3) The provisions of subsection (2) of section 138 of The Vehicles Act, 1957, shall apply to every driver approaching and facing such a sign.
4. The council may by resolution provide for the erection and maintenance on any road, and at any designated points or point thereon, of such signs as it may deem expedient for the legal control, warning, guidance, direction or information thereon.
5. Notwithstanding the provisions of this bylaw, no signs shall be so placed as to face traffic upon a provincial highway.
6. No person shall, except where authorized by resolution of the council, or when duly authorized by the law, erect upon or immediately adjacent to any highway, any sign, marker, signal or light or any advertising sign or device.
7. No person shall deface, damage, destroy or remove any sign erected pursuant to this bylaw.
8. Any person found guilty of any provision of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the general penalty bylaw of the village.

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON THE HIGHWAYS  
WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF ELBOW.

The council of the Village of Elbow in the province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. For the purpose of this bylaw the expression:
  - (a) "angle parking" shall mean the parking of vehicles with the right front wheel drawn up to the curb on the right hand side of the highway, or at a distance of not more than 12 inches from such curb, the vehicle to be placed at an angle of forty-five degrees with the curb;
  - (b) "curb" shall mean the lateral boundaries of a roadway, whether or not marked by curbing;
  - (c) "highway" shall mean any street or public highway within the village;
  - (d) "parallel parking" shall mean the parking of a vehicle with both right wheels thereof drawn up to the curb on the right hand side of the highway, or at a distance of not more than 12 inches from such curb;
  - (e) "park", "parking", "motor vehicle", and "vehicle" shall respectively have the meanings ascribed thereto by the Vehicles Act, 1957;
2. This bylaw shall be read and construed as being subject to the provisions of section 15 of The Vehicles Act, 1957.
3. Except as otherwise specifically provided herein, or as may from time to time be provided by resolution of the council, the parking of vehicles is hereby permitted on all highways within the Village.
4. (1) Subject to the provisions of subsection (2) hereof no person shall park a vehicle in any lane, nor in any street so as to obstruct the entrance to any lane or to a driveway or approach leading to private premises;  
(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) a farm truck or commercial vehicle may be parked in any lane for the purpose only of taking on or discharging cargo therefrom, provided no such truck or vehicle shall be so parked for a period exceeding thirty minutes at one time unless permission shall first have been obtained from the secretary-treasurer or a police officer of the village for an extension of such time limit.
5. (1) No person shall park a vehicle in any of the following areas, at any time, whether such areas are so marked on the curb or otherwise to indicate that parking therein is prohibited, namely:  
"the spaces along the curb, on the same side of the street as, and measuring fifteen (15) feet both ways along such curb from the projection of the centre line of any entrance to, or exit from, any church or other place of public worship, any school, theatre, dance hall, community hall, or moving picture house".  
(2) The council may from time to time by resolution designate other streets or highways or portions thereof as "no parking" areas, and it shall thereafter be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle in any area so designated.
- (3) Every "no parking" area designated pursuant to subsection (2) shall be clearly marked by appropriate painted metal or wooden posts or markers or by curb markings in such manner as to be visible from that part of the street or highway to which such restriction applies, indicating that parking therein is prohibited.
6. No person shall park a vehicle on any street at one place for any period of time exceeding twenty-four(24) consecutive hours.

7. (1) No person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle under his control to stand unattended on any highway unless such vehicle shall first have been properly parked in the manner as provided by this bylaw.

(2) No person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle under his control whether properly parked or otherwise, to be left unattended with its motor running.

(3) A motor vehicle shall be deemed to have been left unattended for the purpose of this section unless the same is under the immediate charge of a person lawfully entitled to operate the same.

8. (1) Subject to subsection (2), no person shall park any commercial vehicle carrying or intended for the carrying of a cargo of oil, gasoline or other inflammable, combustible or explosive material, within 100 feet from any building in the village used for intended for use, in whole or in part, as a place of dwelling, a hotel or place of public assembly (and for the purpose of this subsection, a place of public assembly shall include schools, theatres, moving picture theatres, churches, hockey and skating rinks, dance halls and public assembly halls).

(2) Nothing in subsection (1) shall be deemed to restrict the parking of any such vehicle for such period of time as may be necessary to take on or discharge cargo therefrom.

9. (1) Subject to subsections (2) and (3), every person parking a vehicle upon any street or highway within the village where parking is permitted shall parallel park the same.

(2) Every person parking a vehicle upon any street or highway parking is permitted within the village shall parallel park with the exception of Saskatchewan Street and the North-east side of Railway Avenue which shall angle park.

(3) The council may from time to time by resolution vary the provisions of subsection (1) or (2), provided that where such provisions are so varied, the council shall cause appropriate painted metal or wooden posts or markers, or curb markings, to be made in such a manner that the same shall be visible from that part of the street or highway affected, indicating the type of parking therein permitted.

10. No person shall deface, damage, destroy or remove any sign or marker erected pursuant to this bylaw.

11. Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this bylaw, or guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of any resolution of the council passed pursuant to this bylaw, shall upon conviction thereof be liable to the penalties as imposed by the general penalty bylaw of the village, being bylaw No. 2/62, enacted on the 21st day of March, 1962.

A BYLAW OF THE VILLAGE OF ELBOW TO PROVIDE FOR RAISING THE SUM OF TWENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED & NINETY-FOUR---02/100 DOLLARS (\$27,894.02) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE COST OF LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS SET OUT IN THE SCHEDULE HEREIN, A PORTION OF THE COST OF WHICH SHALL BE PAYABLE BY THE PROPERTY OWNERS ON THE SPECIAL FRONTAGE ASSESSMENT SYSTEM.

WHEREAS pursuant to notice of intention regularly given by publication in the Outlook on the 1st day of June, 1961, and the 8th day of June, 1961, and by virtue of the authorization contained in Bylaw No. 26A, sewer mains have been constructed as shown in Schedule "A" and the lifetime of the said work has been duly ascertained and finally determined as twenty-two(22) years; and WHEREAS the consent of the Minister of Public Health to the construction of the sewer mains mentioned has been obtained in terms of the Public Health Act in that behalf, and

Whereas the special assessment for the part of the cost payable by special frontage assessment has been made and all appeals therefrom (if any) have been duly heard and determined as provided by the Town Act; and

WHEREAS for the purpose of paying the cost to the Village of the said works set out in Schedule "A" it is necessary to borrow the sum of Twenty-Seven Thousand, Eight Hundred & Ninety-Four P---02/100 Dollars (\$27,894.02) which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this bylaw and to issue debentures therefor; and

WHEREAS it is expedient to make the principal of the said debt repayable in twenty(20) equal consecutive annual instalments in such manner that the amount of the annual instalments of principal and interest payable in each year shall be as nearly as possible equal to the amount of the instalments of principal and interest payable in each of the other years of the said period of twenty (20) years; and

WHEREAS the number of feet frontage of the land abutting and assessable on the streets aforesaid; the cost per foot frontage chargeable against the lands abutting on the said works; the rate per foot frontage to be levied in each year for a period of twenty(20) years on the lands chargeable by the special frontage assessments are set out in Schedule "A" to this bylaw; and

WHEREAS it will require a total amount of Two Thousand, Five Hundred and Thirty-One and 56/100 Dollars (\$2,531.56) to be raised annually for the said

period of twenty years for the payment of the debt and interest; and

WHEREAS the total value of the land upon which the special assessment herein-after provided for is to be levied according to the last revised assessment

roll is Twenty-Seven Thousand, Eight Hundred and Ninety Dollars(\$27,890);and

WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property in the said Village according to the last revised assessment roll, namely, the assessment roll for the Village of Elbow for the year 1961, is Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand,

One Hundred and Fifty Dollars; and

WHEREAS the total amount of the existing debenture debt of the Village, including debentures authorized and unsold, but exclusive of local improvements secured by special assessments, debt incurred under The Secondary Education Act, and securities held in the sinking fund to the credit of remaining indebtedness is Seven Thousand Dollars(\$7,000.00); and

WHEREAS no part of the above mentioned debt is in arrears;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the Village of Elbow enacts as follows:

1. The sum of Twenty-Seven Thousand, Eight Hundred and Ninety-Four---02/100 Dollars(\$27,894.02) shall be borrowed by the Village of Elbow by way of debentures for the purpose of defraying the cost of the works authorized under bylaw 31A and for the said purpose there shall be borrowed upon the credit of the Village at large the sum of Twenty-Seven Thousand, Eight Hundred and Ninety-Four---02/100 Dollars(\$27,894.02) and debentures of the Village shall be issued therefor, bearing interest at the rate of six and one-half(6½)per cent per annum payable yearly, having coupons attached thereto for the payment of the instalments of principal and interest due in each of the years of the currency of the said debentures.
2. The said debentures shall bear the date of the 1st day of June, A.D. 1962, and the coupons attached thereto representing the respective instalments of principal and interest shall mature on the 1st day of June, 1963 to 1982 inclusive respectively. The said coupons shall be payable in lawful money of Canada, at the principal office of The Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce, in the Village of Hawarden, Saskatchewan, in Canada.
3. The said debentures shall be sealed with the seal of the Village and shall be signed by the Overseer and Secretary-Treasurer and the coupons attached to the said debentures shall bear the signatures of the Overseer and Secretary-Treasurer. Provided that the signatures of the Overseer and Secretary-Treasurer on the coupons attached to such debentures may be reproduced by lithographing or printing or any other method of mechanical reproduction.

During the Twenty (20) years the currency of the said debentures, the sum of Two Thousand, Five Hundred and Thirty-one -----56/100 Dollars (\$2,531.56) shall be raised annually for the payment of the debt and interest as follows:-

The sum of Seven Dollars and Eighty-four cents (\$7.84) shall be raised annually for the payment of the corporation's portion of the ~~appx~~ cost and the interest thereon, and the ~~same~~ shall be raised annually by a special rate sufficient thereon on all the rateable property of the Village at the same time and in the same manner as other rates, and in addition thereto, and for the payment of the property owner's portion of the cost and the interest thereon, the special assessment hereinbefore mentioned is hereby imposed upon the lands liable therefor as therein set forth, which said special assessment with a sum sufficient to cover interest thereon, making the sum of Two Thousand, Five Hundred and Twenty-Three----- and 72/100 Dollars (\$2,523.72) shall be raised annually by a special annual rate per foot frontage upon the lots entered in the said special assessment roll according to the assessed frontage thereof, over and above all other rates and taxes and in addition thereto, and the special taxes shall be collected annually, at the same time and in the same manner as other rates.

The said debentures shall be issued on the credit and security of the Village at large, but as to the portion to be levied by special frontage assessment on the lands abutting on the said works, the Village shall collect the same only by way of special frontage assessment as aforesaid.

THIS Bylaw shall take effect on the day of the final passing thereof.

SCHEDULE "A" attached hereto shall be read with and form a part of this bylaw.



A BYLAW OF THE VILLAGE OF ELBOW RESPECTING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS IN CONNECTION WITH WATER MAINS.

WHEREAS the Village's engineer has submitted his report certifying that in his opinion the sum of Twenty- nine cents (29¢) for water mains does not exceed the sum which on the average might be fairly and equitably imposed in respect of such species of work abutting property throughout the Village having regard to the provisions of Sections 529 and 530 of the Town Act.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable and expedient that the said special rates for water mains be levied against the abutting properties as provided for by Section 533 of the Town Act;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Village of Elbow enacts as follows:

1. In the case of all water mains constructed or to be constructed in the Village of Elbow, a fixed sum of 29 cents per foot frontage of the lots abutting on the streets whereon or wherein such mains are laid shall be levied by way of special frontage assessment in each year of the repayment period of the debt incurred of Twenty (20) years, being within the estimated lifetime of the work.

The Village's share of the cost of any such work shall include all that portion of the total cost of the work not raised by the uniform frontage rate referred to herein and shall also include the cost of such portions of water mains as are laid opposite lots which are exempted, either wholly or in part, from special frontage assessments pursuant to the second enacting clause hereof, to the extent of such exemptions.

2. The following exemptions shall be allowed from the assessment of the uniform frontage rates provided for in the first enacting clause hereof:

(a) Lots which are exempt by law from special frontage assessments.

(b) All of the flankage in the case of a corner lot to a maximum of One Hundred and Fifty feet. Where the number of feet included in such flankage exceeds the said One Hundred and Fifty feet, the excess shall be charged with the special assessments provided herein.

Provided that in the case of triangular or irregularly shaped lots, a reduction or increase shall be made in the special assessment which otherwise would be chargeable by deducting from or adding to, respectively, the total frontage of the lot liable to the special assessment to the extent determined by relating the area of the said lot to a lot having

an area based on fifty (50) foot frontage and a depth of one hundred and twenty feet (120) the proportion to be of the said fifty (50) foot frontage with any reduction to be included in the Village's share of the cost or any increase to accrue to the Village as applicable.

3. In this bylaw:

- 4a) "flankage" means the longer side of a corner lot.
- (b) "corner lot" means a lot situated at the junction or intersection of streets, either or both of which may be a lane or an alley.

4. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the day of final passing thereof.

A BYLAW of the Village of Elbow to provide for the control of Untidy and Unsightly Premises.

The Council of the Village of Elbow enacts as follows:

1. This bylaw shall come into force on the day of the final passing thereof.
2. The medical health officer, sanitary officer or police constable are hereby authorized to declare any premises untidy **and** unsightly and to carry out the provisions of Section 212 of the Village Act, Province of Saskatchewan.

BYLAW NO. 25/62

A BYLAW OF THE VILLAGE OF ELBOW TO AMEND BYLAW NO. 17/62 OF THE SAID VILLAGE

WHEREAS the Council of the Village of Elbow has heretofore passed Bylaw No. 17/62 on the 2nd day of April, 1962, which provides for the issue of debentures of the Village to the amount of twenty-seven Thousand, Eight Hundred and Ninety-four and 02/100 Dollars (\$27,894.02), repayable in twenty(20) equal consecutive annual instalments of principal and interest combined, interest being at the rate of six and one-half per centum (~~6 1/2%~~) per annum; and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Council, with a view to the better marketing of the Village's securities, it is desirable that the debentures authorized by Bylaw No. 17/62 bear a rate of interest differing from the rate specified in the said bylaw; and

WHEREAS it is desirable and expedient to change the interest rate provided for ~~by~~ said Bylaw No. 17/62 from six and one-half per centum (6 1/2%) per annum to six per centum (6%) per annum; and

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to amend the said bylaw by changing the mode of issue of the said debentures to provide that the principal of the said debt be repayable in such manner that, without combining the principal and interest, the instalments of principal, in multiples of \$1,000.00, shall be of such amounts that, with the interest payable annually, the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in each year during the period of twenty (20) years shall be as nearly as possible the same; and

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to provide the dates on which the debentures and various interest coupons are to mature, and to add the City of Regina as a place of payment; and

WHEREAS no debentures have heretofore been issued by the Village under authority of the said bylaw; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the Village of Elbow enacts as follows:-

1. THE 4th recital of the said bylaw shall be and is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor:

"AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make the principal of the said debt repayable in such manner that, without combining the principal and interest, the instalments of principal, in multiples of \$1,000.00, shall be of such amounts that, with the interest payable annually, at the rate of six per centum (6%) per annum, the aggregate amount payable for principal and

interest in each year during the period of twenty (20) years shall be as nearly as possible the same".

2. THE said bylaw is hereby amended by deleting the 6th recital thereof and substituting the following therefor:

AND WHEREAS it will be necessary to raise the annual amounts as in this bylaw set forth, during the said period of twenty (20) years, being the currency of the debentures to be issued hereunder, to pay the several instalments of principal and interest as they become due".

3. THE first enacting clause of the said bylaw shall be amended by deleting the following words where they appear therein:

" and debentures of the Village shall be issued therefor, bearing interest at the rate of six and one-half per centum (6½%) per annum, payable yearly, having coupons attached thereto for the payment of the instalments of principal and interest due in each of the years of the currency of the debentures".

and by substituting the following words and figures therefor:

" and one or more debentures of the Village shall be issued bearing interest at the rate of six per centum (6%) per annum, payable annually, equal to the amount of the instalments of principal, in multiples of \$1,000.00, due in each year, having coupons attached thereto for the payment of interest due in each of the years of the currency of the said debentures".

4. THE 2nd enacting clause of the said bylaw shall be deleted and the following substituted therefor:-

"2. The said debentures shall be dated the First day of June, 1962. Such debentures and the interest coupons attached thereto shall mature on the First day of June in each year commencing with the year 1963. The debentures and the interest coupons shall be payable at the principal office of the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce, in either the City of Regina, or the Village of Hawarden, Saskatchewan, in Canada, at the holder's option".

5. THE said bylaw is further amended by deleting the fourth enacting clause and by substituting therefor the following:-

"4. DURING the currency of the debentures the sums set out in column four(4) of Schedule "A" shall be raised each year for the payment of the debt and interest as follows:-

The sum set out in column six (6) of Schedule "A" shall be raised each year for the payment of the Village's portion of the cost and interest thereon, and shall be levied and raised annually by a special rate

therefor, over and above all other rates on the rateable property in the Village at the same time and in the same manner as other rates.

For the payment of the owner's portion of the cost and interest thereon the special assessments set forth in Schedule "A" to this bylaw are hereby imposed upon the lands liable therefor as therein set forth which said special assessment shall be payable in annual instalments for the number of years set forth in the said schedule and for that purpose the special annual rate per foot frontage set forth in the said schedule hereto annexed is hereby imposed upon the lands entered in the said special assessment roll according to the assessed frontage thereof over and above all other rates and taxes and the said special rate shall be collected annually by the collector of taxes for the Village at the same time and in the same manner as other rates. The surplus amount which will be raised each year as shown in Column six (6) of Schedule "A" hereto shall not be used for any other purpose than to meet the whole or part of the Village's portion of the cost of sewer main extensions in the Village in the future.

6. THE 7th enacting clause of the said bylaw shall be amended by deleting the letter "A" where it appears therein and by substituting the following therefor: "A" and "B".

7. THE schedule hereto attached and marked "A" shall take effect in all respects as Schedule "B" to Bylaw No. 17/62 of the Village of Elbow.

8. THIS bylaw shall take effect on the date of approval being issued by the Local Government Board in accordance with Section 364 of the Town Act, being Chapter 136, R.S.S.1953.

A BYLAW OF THE VILLAGE OF ELBOW TO AMEND BYLAW 18/62 ENTITLED "A BYLAW OF THE VILLAGE OF ELBOW IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN FOR BORROWING THE SUM OF TWENTY-ONE THOUSAND (\$21,000.00) DOLLARS FOR THE PURPOSE OF: PAYING THE COST OF THE INSTALLATION OF A WATERWORKS SYSTEM CONSISTING OF THE CPR WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM, TREATMENT PLANT, AND C.P.R. ELEVATED STORAGE TANK AND DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM".

WHEREAS it is desirable and expedient to amend Bylaw No. 18/62 of the Village of Elbow to change the mode of issue of the debentures to be issued under such bylaw, and to provide the date of the said debentures and the place of payment;

WHEREAS no debentures have heretofore been issued by the Village under the authority of the said Bylaw No. 18/62;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the Village of Elbow enacts as follows:-

1. THAT the first enacting clause of the said bylaw is hereby amended by striking out the following words and figures where they appear in the said clause:-

" and debentures shall be issued therefor, payable to bearer in twenty (20) equal consecutive annual instalments of principal and interest combined" and by substituting therefor the following words and figures:

" and one or more debentures of the Village shall be issued bearing interest at the rate of Six (6%) per centum per annum, payable yearly, equal to the amount of the instalments of principal, in multiples of \$1,000.00 due in each year, having coupons attached thereto for the payment of interest due in each of the years of the currency of the said debentures".
2. THE second enacting clause of the said bylaw is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:-

"2. The said debentures shall bear date of the First day of July 1962. Such debentures and the interest coupons attached thereto shall mature on the First day of July in each year during the currency of the debentures, commencing with the year 1963. The debenture and interest coupons shall be payable in lawful money of Canada at the principal office of the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce, in either the City of Regina or the Village of Hawarden, Saskatchewan, in Canada at the holder's option.

3. THE fourth enacting clause of the said bylaw is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:-

"4. DURING the currency of the debentures the following amounts shall be raised in each year for the payment of the debt and interest:





BYLAW 27/62

A BYLAW OF THE VILLAGE OF ELBOW TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF SEVENTY FIVE THOUSAND (\$75,000.00) FROM THE CANADIAN IMPERIAL BANK OF COMMERCE.

WHEREAS the Village of Elbow requires to borrow certain moneys from the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce;

AND WHEREAS the Village has authorized by Bylaw under the Village Act, 1960, the issue of debentures in the principal sum of Seventy-Five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$75,000.00) as by such bylaw provided;

And WHEREAS pending the sale of the said debentures it has been determined to authorize the Overseer and Secretary-Treasurer of the Village to raise money by way of loan on the said debentures and to deposit and hypothecate the same for such loan;

NOW THEREFORE be it and it is hereby enacted as Bylaw 27/62 of the Council of the Village of Elbow in meeting assembled:-

1. The Overseer and Secretary-Treasurer of the Village of Elbow be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce the sum of Seventy-five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$75,000.00) and to pay or agree to pay interest thereon either in advance or at maturity and in either case after maturity at the rate of 5 $\frac{1}{4}$  per centum per annum.
2. The Overseer and Secretary-Treasurer of the Village are hereby authorized on behalf of the Council to execute under the seal of the Village as a promissory note or notes in favour of said Bank for the amount of said loan with interest as aforesaid payable on demand.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Overseer and Secretary-Treasurer of the Village do deposit with and hypothecate to the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce all the above-mentioned debentures to be held by the said Bank as a continuing and additional security for payment of all or any part of the moneys to be borrowed pursuant to this bylaw and interest thereon but the Bank shall not be restricted to the said securities for repayment of the amount so borrowed and the Overseer and Secretary-Treasurer of the Village are hereby authorized to execute under the seal of the Village in favour of said Bank an hypothecation of said securities in the form presented herewith.

THAT the Overseer and Secretary-Treasurer of the Village be and they are hereby authorized to deliver all of the said securities to the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce along with the said Hypothecation and to execute the necessary transfers of all of the said securities under the seal of the Village.

Water-- Capital dated July 1st, 1962. \$21,000.00

Water-- Local improvement --Amount and particulars not known until the system completed.

The said securities or any part thereof are hypothecated as aforesaid as continuing and additional security for payment of the said loan or loans and interest thereon subject to previous hypothecations, if any. This hypothecation shall come into force and effect on the said loan or loans or any part thereof being made.

The said securities or any part thereof from time to time may be realized, sold, transferred and delivered by the bank in such manner as may seem to it advisable and without notice to the Village in the event of any default in payment of the said loan or interest thereon or prior to any such default in the event that the said securities or any part thereof from time to time shall in the opinion of the Bank depreciate in value. The proceeds may be held in lieu of the securities realized and may as and when the Bank thinks fit be appropriated on account of such parts of the said loan or loans and interest thereon as to the Bank ~~seems best~~ without prejudice to the claim of the Bank upon the Village for any deficiency. Should the Bank at any time or from time to time determine upon a realization, sale and/or transfer of the said securities or any part thereof for any reason above stated then all and every formality prescribed by law or otherwise in relation to such realization, sale and/or transfer is hereby waived by the Village. Any moneys which may be received by the Village in respect of the said securities or renewals thereof or substitutions therefor shall be received as trustee for the Bank and shall be forthwith paid over to the Bank. In case any security or substituted security transferred or assigned to or lodged with the Bank is a certificate for shares of stock in any Company or a bond or other security of any kind with a blank transfer and Power of Attorney in blank to transfer the same as may be requisite endorsed thereon or attached thereto the Bank and each of its officers or employees is hereby authorized and empowered to complete all blanks in such transfers and Powers of Attorney with such names and in such manner as may be thought best by the Bank or any such officer or employee and to seal and deliver the same after such blanks have been filled in.

The Village of Elbow agrees with and warrants to the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce that there has been no previous hypothecation of the said securities or any of them.





A BYLAW OF THE VILLAGE OF ELBOW TO AUTHORIZE THE CONSTRUCTION OF WATER MAINS ON CERTAIN STREETS OF THE VILLAGE AS A LOCAL IMPROVEMENT.

WHEREAS notice of intention has been given by the Council of the Village of Elbow to undertake the construction of water mains on the streets indicated hereunder by publication of such notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper circulating in the Village and petitions against the construction of the work have not been received from a majority of the owners representing at least one-half the value of the lots which are liable to be specially assessed:

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to raise by way of temporary loans or advances, an amount sufficient to meet the cost of the work hereinafter described pending the completion thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the Village of Elbow enacts as follows:-



A BYLAW OF THE VILLAGE OF ELBOW TO PROVIDE FOR THE RAISING OF THE SUM OF FOURTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$14,000.00) ON THE CREDIT AND SECURITY OF THE VILLAGE AT LARGE FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE ADDITIONAL COSTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE INSTALLATION OF A WATERWORKS SYSTEM IN THE VILLAGE.

WHEREAS the Village of Elbow has heretofore constructed a waterworks system at the expense of the corporation at large; and

WHEREAS it is necessary to provide for additional costs in connection with the installation of the waterworks system amounting to Fourteen Thousand dollars (\$14,000.00) and to borrow the said sum under the authority contained in Section 255A of the Village Act; and

WHEREAS it will be necessary for such purpose to borrow money by the issue and sale of debentures of the Village of Elbow in the principal amount of Fourteen Thousand dollars (\$14,000.00) bearing interest at the rate of Six per centum (6%) per annum, payable annually, which is the amount of debt intended to be created by this bylaw; and

WHEREAS it is expedient to make the principal of the said debt repayable in Twenty (20) equal consecutive annual instalments of principal and interest combined; and

WHEREAS the amount of the rateable property of the Village, in accordance with the last revised assessment roll (to wit, the assessment roll for the year 1962,) is Two Hundred and Sixty-nine Thousand, Three Hundred Dollars (\$269,300.00); and

WHEREAS the total amount of the existing debenture debt of the Village, including debentures authorized and unsold, is

Dollars; and

WHEREAS no part of either the principal or interest of the said existing debenture debt of the Village is in arrears, and

WHEREAS it will be necessary to raise annually the sum of One Thousand, Two Hundred and Twenty and 50/100 Dollars (\$1,220.50) for the period of Twenty (20) years to pay the several instalments of principal and interest as they become due; and

WHEREAS the Minister of Public Health has given his approval to the said works;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF ELBOW enacts as follows;

1. FOR the purpose of defraying the cost of the work herein mentioned, there shall be raised or borrowed on the credit and security of the Village at large the sum of Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000.00) of lawful money of Canada, and debentures of the Village shall be issued therefor, bearing interest at the rate of six per centum (6%) per annum, payable annually, having coupons attached thereto for the payment of the instalments of

principal and interest due in each of the years of the currency of the said debentures.

2. THE debentures shall bear the date of 1st day of September, A.D. 1962, and the coupons attached thereto representing the respective instalments of principal and interest shall mature on the 1st day of September, 1963 to 1982 inclusive respectively. The said coupons shall be payable in lawful money of Canada, at the principal office of the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce in either the City of Regina or the Village of Hawarden, Saskatchewan, in Canada at the holder's option.
3. The debentures shall be signed by the Overseer and Secretary-Treasurer of the Village and the debentures shall be sealed with the corporate seal of the Village; provided that the signatures of the Overseer and Secretary-Treasurer on such coupons attached to the said debentures may be reproduced by lithographing or printing or any other method of mechanical reproduction.
4. DURING Twenty (20) years, being the currency of the said debentures, the sum of One Thousand, Two Hundred and Twenty and 50/100 Dollars (\$1,220.50) shall be raised annually for the payment of the debt and interest by a special rate sufficient therefor on all rateable property of the Village, at the same time and in the same manner as all other rates and taxes, and in addition thereto.
5. The debt created by the issue of the said debentures is contracted on the credit and security of the Village at large.
6. THIS bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the day of the final passing thereof.




