



Introduced Bylaw 2/81 - a bylaw to establish and control a cemetery

The Council of the Village of Elbow enacts as follows:

1. That part of the SWquarter of Section 11, Township 25, Range 5, West of the 3rd Meridian in the Province of Saskatchewan, acquired by the Village for cemetery purposes, and subdivided as shown on a map or plan of Elbow Cemetery registered in the Land Titles Office at Moose Jaw as Plan number Y-3364 shall be and is appropriate as a public cemetery to be called the Elbow Cemetery.
2. The management and control of the cemetery shall be vested in the Council, which shall allot burial lots therein and issue receipts therefore, and may make regulations governing the same, not inconsistent with this bylaw.
3. No person shall allow any interment to be made in his or her lot for remuneration.
4. The holder of a lot may, subject to the approval of the Council, erect proper stones or monuments and cultivate trees, shrubs and plants thereon but no such tree or shrub shall be cut down or destroyed without the consent of the council.
5. If any tree or shrub, by means of its roots, branches or otherwise, becomes detrimental to an adjacent lot or dangerous or inconvenient, the Council may direct the removal of such tree or shrub or parts thereof.
6. The Council may remove any monument, enclosure or any inscription placed in or upon any lot which it deems to be improper or injurious to the appearance of the cemetery.
7. The Council may from time to time make such rules and regulations for the government of the grounds as it deems necessary and proper to secure and promote the general objects of the cemetery.

8. The holders of lots and their families shall be allowed access to the grounds at all times and may improve their lots at any time.
9. The interment of the poor and of persons unable to pay the necessary expenses shall be in such portions of the grounds as may be designated from time to time by the Council, which may in its discretion furnish free graves for such persons.
10. All funds and fees received from the license of burial lots shall be applied solely to the purchasing, laying out, fencing, ornamenting and keeping in repair the cemetery and roads and accesses thereto, and in defraying all necessary expenses.
11. The council may employ such surveyors, gardeners and caretakers as it deems necessary and may pay them such remuneration as it deems proper.
12. The caretaker shall have supervision over the whole cemetery subject to the direction of council.
13. Any person who willfully destroys, mutilates, defaces, injures or removes any tomb, monument, gravestone, or any structure, railing or other work for the protection or ornamentation of the cemetery or any burial lot, or who willfully destroys, cuts breaks or injures any tree, shrub or plant or flowers, or plays any game or sport, discharges firearms except at a military funeral or willfully or unlawfully disturbs the peace and good order of the cemetery, or who commits a nuisance or behaves in an indecent or unseemly manner shall be liable to the penalties provided for an infractor of this bylaw.
14. The caretaker of the cemetery shall be in attendance at every interment.
15. In order that an accurate register of burials may be kept a statement shall be handed to the caretaker at the time of burial setting forth the burial lot number, the name, residence, age of the deceased person, married or single, and giving such other information as may be prescribed from time to time.
16. When possible at least one day's notice of an intended burial shall be given to the caretaker. Such notice shall state the size of the coffin or, the measurement of the case, and the location of the grave.
17. No graves shall be opened and no disinterment shall take place unless a written permit is obtained from the Deputy Minister of Health.
18. That Council by resolution set the sums paid for lots or plots that are to be charged to applicants at time of selection.
19. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Village.
20. Bylaw 3/64 is hereby repealed.
21. That the sums for lots or plots to be charged to the applicants at the time of selection be set by Council. And that such rates as set by Council shall under a separate Bylaw, known as a bylaw to fix the sums paid for lots or plots at the Elbow Cemetery, shall form a part of this Bylaw.

A Bylaw to establish a Summer Watering Schedule, thereby regulating the days for outside watering.

The Council of the Village of Elbow in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

Effective April 1 through September 30 of each year, the Summer Watering Schedule shall be as follows:

1. No water shall be used for other than home domestic use, with the following exceptions:
 - a) Residents whose property fronts on the north side of the street and those fronting on Railway Avenue shall use outside water only on the odd calendar days of the month.
 - b) Residents whose property fronts on the south side of the street shall use outside water on the even calendar days of the month.
 - c) Rural hook ups shall use outside water on the even calendar days of the month.
2. The penalty for any person found guilty for an infraction of any provisions of this bylaw shall be at the discretion of the justice of the peace before whom proceedings are taken for the enforcement of the bylaw.
3. This bylaw shall come into effect on the date of approval being issued by the Minister. Bylaw 4/81 is hereby repealed.

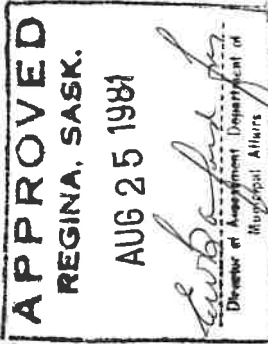



4. The following sums shall be charged for licences and shall be paid by applicants at the time of selection:
Single graves for adults 4ft. by 10ft. - \$100.00
Single graves for children 4ft. by 5ft. - 50.00
5. No licensee of a lot shall allow any interment made therein for remuneration.
6. The licensee of a lot may, subject to the approval of the council, erect proper stones or monuments and cultivate trees, shrubs, and plants thereon but no such tree or shrub shall be cut down or destroyed without the consent of the countil.
7. If any tree or shrub, by means of its roots, branches or otherwise, becomes detrimental to an adjacent lot or avenue or dangerous or inconvenient, the council may direct the removal of such tree or shrub or parts thereof.
8. The council may remove any monument, enclosure or any inscription placed in or upon any lot which it deems to be improper or injurious to the appearance of the cemetery.
9. The licensees of lots and their families shall be allowed access to the grounds at all reasonable times and may improve their lots at such times.
10. The interment of destitute persons shall be in such portions of the grounds as may be designated from time to time by the council.
11. No burial shall take place in the cemetery except when the caretaker or his agent is present.
- 12/ The secretary treasurer (or the caretaker of the cemetery) shall keep an accurate record setting forth the name of the deceased person, the location of burial of such person and the date of burial.
13. When possible at least one day's notice of an intended burial shall be given to the caretaker. Such notice shall be given to the caretaker. Such notice shall state the size of the coffin or, the measurement of the case, and the location of the grave.



A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH AND CONTROL A CEMETERY

The council of the Village of Elbow in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. That part of the SW quarter of section 11, township 25, range 5, west of the 3rd meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan, acquired by the village for cemetery purposes as approved by the Registrar under The Cemeteries Act shall be and is hereby appropriated as a public cemetery to be call the Elbow cemetery.
2. Subject to the provisions of section 11 hereof no burial shall be made in the Elbow cemetery unlwss a licence has been first obtained in accordance with this bylaw.
3. Upon written application therefor and upon payment of the fees hereinafter set forth, the secretary treasurer of this village, shall issue a licence for a burial lot for the burial of a deceased person in the Elbow cemetery.
