COUNCIL NOTES

Council passed the 2025 Budget at the April Council Meeting. A copy is posted on the *Village Website.

The repairs to the intersection of Railway Ave/Saskatchewan St to Minto St were finished. Please use **TRUCK ROUTE** (Elevator Rd) for all heavy trucks.

Noise Bylaw 5-2025, Waste Management Bylaw 6-2025 were adopted - view on website or in office.

Quotes were accepted for replacing tin on shop roof, painting village office, Sask St crack sealing, paving repair at Sask St/Bison Ave, sewer relining on the trunk line from Princess St to the next manhole south & drip irrigation at HGCC evergreens.

We were approved for Heritage Canada Day funding again this year. This funding requires that events take place on July 1 regardless of the day of the week.

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MUNICIPAL OFFICE INFORMATION

Those businesses that are wishing to temporarily/seasonally set up in the Village (not at the Farmer's Market or on their own commercial property) are asked to purchase a \$100 annual business licence with the Village. You are required to get permission to setup from the property owner as well.

INDUSTRIAL SUBDIVISION LOTS

The Village of Elbow has 12 lots for sale in the Industrial Subdivision - 3 of the lots are presently being advertised on the MLS website at:

The Village is offering to finance the lots over 3 years with 10% down, with the requirement that building begins within the first year of purchase. If you build a business, there are Business Tax Incentives that would also apply. Please contact the office with any questions.

HIGHWAY SIGN CORRIDOR

The Village of Elbow has a sign corridor along Highway 19 on both sides of the highway that will start at the ELBOW 1 signs and run for 2 km. Want to advertise your business in the corridor? The Potable Water System and Distribution System reports from Sask Water are available on our website under Public Notices.

WATER METER RECONNECTIONS

Returning Seasonal Residents: When you need to have your water meter reconnected, please contact Karen at the Village Office to set up a time. We require 48hrs notice for reconnections and please remember that someone living at the property (or a trusted individual of your choice) must be present at the time of reconnection to ensure that there are no leaks. Water meters will not be reconnected on weekends.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING

If you need garbage/recycling roll-out carts contact Karen at the Village Office. Carts may not be able to be dropped off on the day you call in and they will not be dropped off on weekends, so please plan ahead. There is no longer the option for residents to turn these back in for storage while away. If you are away for an extended period of time, please store in a safe place on your property.

REMEMBER:

• When your garbage and/or recycling carts have been emptied, move them back on to your property and away from the road. The grader or tractor need to maintain the roads and if your cart is on the road, Village Staff do not have time to move carts back to your property. Maintaining the roads in the village is the priority so there is a very good chance that your cart will be knocked over and could be damaged. Then you would have to replace your cart at your cost.

The TRANSFER STATION is now open. Hours have changed: Tuesdays 4-7 & Saturdays 10-2

Introduction of the Line 19 Health Care committee and our purpose:

Hello to all residents (permanent and seasonal) of the line 19 area. Did you know that there is now a committee based out of Elbow that is working on addressing the health care needs of Strongfield, Loreburn, Elbow, Mistusinne and RM 254? The committee members include mayor or council members from each area and community members (some with a healthcare background). Below is a list of short and long term goals we are working on for our community:

- Collaboration with SHA established
- Communicating and distributing SHA information on available health services and how to access them
- Surveys and data collection for evidence of need for increased health services to our area
- Planning in person information sessions with different SHA programs
- Scheduled information memos re: health services, sent out electronically and posted in person on a routine basis
- Working towards a proposal for a Primary Health Care Centre located in Elbow, SK

Memos for June 2025:

- Both Davidson and Outlook health centers will be in service disruption or using virtual physician (physician on a phone call) often this summer. Look out for notices of disruptions shared by your community and this committee. Also, if possible, please call either center prior to visiting so the nurses can inform you if virtual physician is being used before you make the trip.

Mental Health Services	Mental Health and Addiction Services (MHAS) represent a continuum of care ranging from prevention/early intervention through to very specialized treatment, are provided free of charge to adult and youth and child residents of Saskatchewan. A Saskatchewan resident may refer themselves by phoning the general access number or be referred by a family physician. To determine which services are most appropriate, a standardized assessment including a triage is completed. Services offered may include referrals to programming from other community agencies. Home	Davidson/Craik Home Care provides home care support to the community of Elbow. At this time, we are servicing Elbow residents 2-3 days per week. Our goal is to provide service (to Elbow) seven days per week, and we have secured the funding for and are currently working on recruiting for additional Continuing Care Assistants so that we will be able to provide 7-days/week home services. Home Care offers both nursing services, as well as home services. Nursing services require a physician's order to initiate, but home services can be self-initiated. Home services include things such as personal care assistance (bathing/showering), medication assistance, housekeeping, and laundry.
