ASSESSMENT NOTICES

Assessment Notices will be sent on April 8, 2024. You will **only** receive a notice if your assessment values changed since last year or if you are a new property owner. This notice does <u>not</u> tell you what your taxes will be for 2024. The roll is open for 30 days (April 8 to May 10). This is the only time you can appeal your assessment - details are on your notice. Contact the office if you have questions. If you didn't get a notice and want to see your values, contact the office. You can also contact **SAMA** (Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency) as they set the assessed values for all properties in Elbow.

WATER RATE INCREASES

The Village of Elbow passed a two-year utility rate bylaw on Nov.8, 2022, to go along with SaskWater's increase.

Effective April 1, 2024, the utility rates will be:

WATER METER RECONNECTIONS

Returning Seasonal Residents: When you need to have your water meter reconnected, please contact Karen at the Village Office to set up a time. We require 48hrs notice for reconnections and please remember that someone living at the property (or a trusted individual of your choice) must be present at the time of reconnection to ensure that there are no leaks. Water meters will not be reconnected on weekends.

We are embarking on a water meter replacement plan the next few years. If you are on this year's list, we will contact you to have your meter replaced. We plan to replace approximately 30 meters this year so that all of our meters read in cubic meters and replace any that are quite old. At the end of this program, we will have all meters changed/upgraded so that our public works only need to drive by your house to read the meters!

GARBAGE & RECYCLING

If you need garbage/recycling roll-out carts contact Karen at the Village Office. Carts may not be able to be dropped off on the day you call in and they will not be dropped off on weekends, so please plan ahead. There is no longer the option for residents to turn these back in for storage while away. If you are away for an extended period of time, please store in a safe place on your property.

REMEMBER:

• When your garbage and/or recycling carts have been emptied, move them back on to your property and away from the road. The grader or tractor need to maintain the roads and if your cart is on the road, Village Staff do not have time to move carts back to your property. Maintaining the roads in the village is the priority so there is a very good chance that your cart will be knocked over and could be damaged. Then you would have to replace your cart at your cost.

The **TRANSFER STATION** will be open May 1st - weather permitting

In order to receive notices from the village office, please whitelist (below) in your email accounts. Every email carrier is different so we cannot provide instructions for each but it is usually found in settings. In Sasktel.net email addresses, for example: go to your SaskTel email, click settings, then spam and add to trusted senders. Will be similar for other email accounts.
